Suicide is a public health issue that affects individuals, families, workplaces and communities across Australia.

It is an important issue of community concern and NEEDS to be discussed. The way we talk about suicide is important – the words we use do matter!

Please consider the following guidelines when considering a discussion around suicide.

DO SAY		DON'T SAY		WHY?
/	'died by suicide' 'took their own life'	X	'successful suicide' 'unsuccessful suicide'	Because it suggests that suicide is a desired outcome
/	'took their own life' 'died by suicide'	X	'committed suicide' 'commit suicide'	Because it associates suicide with crime or sin
/	'Increasing rates' 'higher rates'	X	'suicide epidemic'	Because it sensationalises suicide
V	'suicide attempt' 'non-fatal attempt'	X	'failed suicide' 'suicide bid'	Because it can glamourise suicide attempts
V	refrain from using the term suicide out of context	X	'political suicide' 'suicide mission'	Because it is an inaccurate use of the term 'suicide'
